


To apply and audition for the Las Vegas Academy, first visit the Clark County School District's Magnet School Application website: MAGNET.CCSD.NET/APPLY

PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

Graphic Design

A portfolio submission (parts 1 & 2) and a skills demonstration video are required for majors listed above.

PORTFOLIO PART 1

The Portfolio submission must include artwork with the specific imagery and use of media listed below:

- I. Still Life drawing using charcoal
- II. Self-Portrait using graphite pencil: draw yourself by looking into a mirror (no photo reference)
- III. Contour Line drawing of your shoe using ballpoint pen
- IV. Colored Landscape Painting using watercolor, acrylic, or oil paint

(Portfolio requirement samples shown)

PORTFOLIO PART 2

(submit work related to the major you're applying to)

A. GRAPHIC DESIGN: 3 to 5 redesigns of major brand logos, typography practices of hand lettering, advertising or packaging design, magazine or poster design. All pieces must be original without copyright infringement.

- * Copyright Characters or Cartoons
- *Anime Styled Works
- *Blurry, out of focus, or poorly lit photos of your work





PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

Portfolio requirements continued. . .

B. PHOTOGRAPHY: 3 to 5 photographs showing the following compositional elements: PATTERN, SYMMETRY, TEXTURE, DEPTH OF FIELD (SHALLOW), and LINES.

- C. SCULPTURE: 3 to 5 3D pieces such as ceramics, wire, wood, plaster, jewelry, and glass
- D. VISUAL DESIGN: 3 to 5 drawings and/or paintings created by observing people, places and things.

PORTFOLIO REQUIREMENTS

FILM & VIDEO PRODUCTION (ONLY)

Film & Video applicants must create and submit a presentation for a short film/video. Include a script, a storyboard (series of panel drawings), and a brief one page essay detailing your specific interest in film and video production. Please combine the 3 requirements and submit one PDF via the magnet application.

HOW TO CREATE YOUR GOOGLE DOCUMENT

1. Log into your gmail account & Click on the google waffle.



2. Select Google Doc & Start a new blank document.



4. Click the Share button, top right of your screen.



5. Save your document with your MagnetID#



6. Click anywhere in the Get Link box.



7. Click on the Restricted tab.



8. Select the share with Anyone with the link



VERY IMPORTANT:

After Inserting and Labeling all your artwork into the google doc, be sure to Download the google doc as a PDF. The Magnet Office Submission Link will only accept a PDF document.

Click on File, select Download, select PDF - file should be saved as your MagnetID#.* (*Be sure to use the abbreviation for the major you are auditioning for)

PHOTOGRAPHY INSTRUCTIONS

- Pay attention to the way you're positioning your artwork.
- Avoid shadows and messy framing by making sure that you are Not shooting at an angle.
- Whenever possible, you should fill the frame with your work, trying not to show any background.
- When your artwork is non-rectangular or 3-D keep the background simple without distractions.
- Frame the piece against a neutral color white is the perfect background.
- Colorful backgrounds can alter the color of your piece by reflecting onto it.
- Use bright, indirect natural lighting. Shoot near a window bathing the room with natural light.
- Avoid deep shadows and dappling effects.
- Position the lights and the artwork carefully before taking the photo. Crop image if necessary.
- File formats should be bitmap JPG or PNG (High resolution scans may also be submitted)

STILL LIFE DRAWING DEMO INSTRUCTIONS

Still Life Drawing Demonstration 30 minute video

Drawing Test Video Requirements:

- -Please do not exceed 30 minutes.
- -Draw your still life arrangement using graphite pencil on white drawing paper.
- -Show your drawing hand and the still life in the video frame during the course of the entire video.
- -Show/hold up the final drawn image at the end of the 30 minute recording.
- -Do not edit or stop the video at any point in the drawing demonstration.
- -SAVE your video as your MagnetID#
- -Log into your Magnet application and Upload video directly to application via upload tab (You may record this video with your computer, phone, chrome book or iPad)

WHAT IS A STILL LIFE?

A still-life is a depiction of inanimate objects for the sake of their qualities of form, color, texture, and composition. Create a still life arrangement of 3 to 5 objects, set them up in front of you, draw these objects as realistically as you can, using graphite pencil on white paper and record your drawing process.

*Take a photograph of the Final Still Life Image at the end of 30 minutes.

HOW WILL THE STILL LIFE BE EVALUATED?

*This still life image will be evaluated on:

- 1. Composition: Format, organization, arrangement & placement of still life objects. How dynamically the student organized the space and still life on the picture plane.
- 2. Handling of Media & Line quality: How well the student applied graphite: use of contour line, directions & qualities of line. How accurately the still life is shaded according to the light source.
- 3. Realistic Rendering: How accurately the student replicated & drew the objects in the still life: accurate placement of objects and application of correct proportions.
- 4. Neatness, Craftsmanship and Originality: Student selected an interesting portion of the still life and drew from their point of view demonstrating age appropriate skill, artistic voice and care for materials.

ONLINE AUDITION REQUIREMENTS & PROCEDURES

FILM/VIDEO PRODUCTION

Complete the Film/Video Production virtual audition for the Visual Arts Department at the Las Vegas Academy of the Arts. (create 1 google doc, see instructions on page 9)

One Upload: Combine the 3 requirements into 1 document and download as PDF

- 1. A short film Script between 4 to 6 pages)
- 2. A Storyboard (a visual rendering or shot for shot of the short film script samples on pg 8)
- 3. A one-page Essay as to why the student wants to be in the Film & Video program (Be sure to download your google doc as a PDF and SAVE AS MagnetID#.Film)

(log into your Magnet Application and upload your audition materials via the upload tabs)
